An Overview Of Our New Venue's Facilities

Visitors to the club Members and Non Members

Free car parking is available opposite the club. It is important to park only in the bays permitted not in marked bays unless you have a permit. If by any chance the car park is full, there is another one a few yards down the road.

As with most community associations, entry is by door phone / Key Code. Just announce that you are visiting the Radio Club, and you will be buzzed in by the door staff. Members however, will be issued with a Door Code.

Meeting Room

We meet in Room 4 (Just in front of the main entrance). There is a small kitchen available to us so that we can make Tea / Coffee as we did in the last venue. We will still collect donations for drinks at 30p per cup.

Room 3 is available for training. This is a smaller room and can double up for use of the radios when antennas have been erected.

If we should decide to hold a rally in the future, a large hall is available for just an event. This hall is equipped with a large kitchen and can be used to sell bacon butties, drinks and sandwiches.

Joining The Page Community Association
